The Nicene Creed

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father.

Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate;
He suffered death and was buried.
On the third day he rose again

Said by all, standing as you are able.

in accordance with the scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, And his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son.

The Prayers of the People

Intercessor: Let us pray for the Church and for the world especially for the Archbishop of Canterbury, our Presiding Bishop, for our own Bishop, for our priests, for all lay and ordained ministers and for all the holy people of God. Lord in your mercy

People: Hear our prayer.

Intercessor: Grant wisdom to those in positions of public trust, that they may serve justice, and promote the dignity and freedom of every person. Lord in your mercy

People: Hear our prayer.

Intercessor: Grant, Almighty God, that all who confess your Name may be united in your truth, live together in your love, and reveal your glory in the world. Lord, in your mercy

People: Hear our prayer.

Intercessor: Guide the mission of the Church, and especially the growth and well-being of our church, that we may preach the Gospel to the ends of the earth, and bring your people into relationship with one another and with you. Lord in your mercy

People: Hear our prayer.

Intercessor: Guide the people of this land, and of all the nations, in the ways of justice and peace; that we may honor one another and serve the common good. Lord, in your mercy **People: Hear our prayer.**

Intercessor: Give us all a reverence for the earth as your own creation, that we may use its resources rightly in the service of others and to your honor and glory. Lord, in your mercy **People: Hear our prayer.**

Intercessor: Bless all whose lives are closely linked with ours, and grant that we may serve Christ in them, and love one another as he loves us. Lord, in your mercy

People: Hear our prayer.

Intercessor: Lord in your mercy, comfort those in greatest need: the sick, the uncertain, the vulnerable and the dying, as we offer you these prayers.

(The intercessor now offers the prayers for the sick and suffering, those in need of God's guidance, those in harms way and those who have died.)

The Confession

Priest: Let us confess our sins against God and our neighbor.

The Absolution

The Peace

Priest: The peace of the Lord be always with you.

People And also with you.

The Offertory sentence: Walk in love as Christ loved us and gave himself for us, and offering and a sacrifice unto God.

The alms are taken to the altar.

People: All things come of thee O Lord, and of thine own have we given thee.

The Eucharist

Please stand.

Now begins the Eucharist or Communion. You are welcome to participate at communion.

You are welcome at communion for blessing or sacrament.

All the baptized (of any age, faith or doubts, marital status) are welcome to receive communion here. Those who are not baptized or who simply don't want to receive communion are invited to come to the altar when it is time and receive a blessing instead. Simply cross your arms over your chest and the priest will know to give you a blessing. To receive the bread put your right hand over your left and the bread will be given to you. You may then dip the wafer in the wine if you so choose.

Priest: The Lord be with you.

People: And also with you.

Priest: Lift up your hearts.

People: We lift them to the Lord.

Priest: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. **People:** It is right to give God thanks and praise.

Priest: It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and every-where to give thanks to you, Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth. (*Here a Proper Preface is sung or said on all Sundays, and on other occasions as appointed.*) Therefore we praise you, joining our voices with Angels and Archangels and with all the company of heaven, who for ever sing this hymn to proclaim the glory of your Name:

Holy, Holy, Holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory.

Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.

We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus, your Son. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world.

In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.

On the night before he died for us, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me." Therefore, according to his command, O Father,

All: We remember his death, We proclaim his resurrection, We await his coming in glory;

And we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to you, O Lord of all; presenting to you, from your creation, this bread and this wine.

We pray you, gracious God, to send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts that they may be the Sacrament of the Body of Christ and his Blood of the new Covenant. Unite us to your Son in his sacrifice, that we may be acceptable through him, being sanctified by the Holy Spirit. In the fullness of time, put all things in subjection under your Christ, and bring us to that heavenly country where, with [______ and] all your saints, we may enter the everlasting heritage of your sons and daughters, through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation.

By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. *AMEN*.

The people receive Communion.

Priest: The Body of Christ, the bread of heaven. The people may respond, "Amen."

The Post Communion Prayer

The priest and people pray:

of your Son our Savior Jesus Christ,
and you have fed us with spiritual food
in the Sacrament of his Body and Blood.
