The Nicene Creed

The Prayers of the People

Watchful at all times, let us pray for strength to stand with confidence before our Maker and Redeemer.

Intercessor: Into our emptiness, into our brokenness:

People: Lord, come down.

Intercessor: Into our busyness and our distractedness:

People: Lord, come down.

Intercessor: Into our past and into our present:

People: Lord, come down.

The Confession

Priest: When the Lord comes, he will bring to light the things now hidden in darkness and will disclose the purposes of the heart. Therefore, in the light of Christ let us confess our sins.

Please kneel as you are able.

Most merciful God,
we confess that we have sinned against you
in thought, word and deed,
By what we have done,
and by what we have left undone.

The Absolution and the Peace

Almighty God have mercy on you; pardon you and set you free. Know that you are forgiven and be at peace. **Amen**.

Priest: May the God of peace make you completely holy, ready for the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. The peace of the Lord be always with you.

The Offertory Sentences

We are the work of God's hands, the psalmist says, and God continues to shape us each day into a people of goodness and peace. That is why we bring gifts this morning: to be part of creating a more beautiful world through the ministry of this church and the witness of our lives each day. Let us gather our gifts together and present them as an offering to God.

The Offering: The gifts are brought forward. The plate is passed for financial offerings which are used to support the mission, ministry and operations of your church. Thank you!

The Offerings are brought up from the back of the church, the ushers stand at the altar steps and we sing:

Praise God from whom all blessings flow, Praise him all creatures here below! Praise him above, ye heavenly host. Praise Father, Son and Holy Ghost!

The Eucharist

Please stand.

Now begins the Eucharist or Communion. You are welcome to participate at communion. All the baptized (of any age, faith or doubts, marital status) are welcome to receive bread and wine here. Those who are not baptized or who simply don't want to receive communion are invited to come to the altar rail with the rest of your pew and receive a blessing instead. Simply cross your arms over your chest and the priest will know to give you a blessing. To receive the bread put your right hand over your left and the bread will be given to you. You can then hold the bread and dip it (intinct it) in the chalice when it is offered. You may also choose to receive only the bread and not the wine. You are welcome here.

Priest: : O come, Emanuel, into our longing hearts.

People: We lift our hearts to You

Presider: As we gather around this table

People: In expectation and hope.

We embrace all that is holy as we sing: (Sanctus)

Holy, Holy, Holy Lord
God of Power and might
Heaven and earth are full of your glory
Hosanna in the highest!
Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord
Hosanna in the highest

In this season of waiting, of shorter, darker days, and of preparation for Christmas, we hear of the coming of Jesus. We hear from the prophets of God's new straight path in the desert and of the hoped for shepherd to feed his flock.

We hear from John the Baptist of one coming after him, one who will baptize with Holy Spirit.

We hear from Jesus of signs and omens, heralding a sudden coming of the Son of Man, the Son of God, and we are warned to be ready. We hear from the angel of the baby, conceived by the Holy Spirit in Mary's womb, who will be a king, a prince of peace who will save his people.

As we open our hearts to this coming, and puzzle as to its meaning for us and for the world, we can't help but remember the rest of the story. Even as we celebrate Jesus' birth, we remember his life, his teachings and healings and compassion. Even as we remember the beginning, we know well of Jesus' suffering and death and Resurrection.

We remember how, on the night before he died, Jesus took bread, gave thanks and broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take, eat, this is my body, given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."

We remember how, after supper, he took the cup of wine, and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying, "Drink this, all of you; this is my blood poured out for you and for everyone. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me.

By the power of the Holy Spirit, sanctify this bread and this wine that they may be for us the body and blood of your son Jesus Christ. Sanctify us also that we may be worthy to receive him.

By him and with him and in him, in the unity of the holy spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and forever. **AMEN**

The Breaking of the Bread

The Celebrant breaks the consecrated Bread.

Priest: Alleluia! Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us.

People: Therefore, let us keep the feast!

Priest: These gifts of bread and wine, are the gifts of God for all God's people Be what you see; receive who you are.

The people receive Communion.

The Bread and the Cup are given to the people with these words

The Body of Christ, the bread of heaven.
The Blood of Christ, the cup of salvation.
The people may respond, "Amen."
The people may respond, "Amen."

The Post Communion Prayer

The priest and people pray:

God of all grace,
may we live in expectation and hope,
and may the gifts we have
received at this table
remind us not only of the gift of your Christ,
but of your steady presence among us,
that we may act faithfully
in response to your love *Amen*
